Prep World . . .

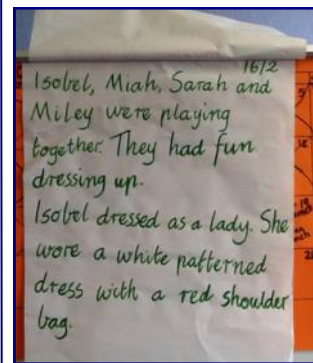
