Principal's Report

Dear parents, families and friends of Ararat Primary School 800,

Congratulations to our Year 3-4 team on the success of their **"Big Day Out"** last Thursday. A brilliant, but exhausting time was had by everyone, and all feedback has been very positive. Without doubt, the most talked about activity was the Eureka Skydeck visit, with the museum exhibitions running a close second. Our unique **Circus program** has been on show this week, with the staging of our annual Showcase events, and a **Bamboozle presentation at the Ararat Performing Arts Centre on Wednesday morning**, as part of the announcement of refurbishment plans for the PAC by Mr Dan Tehan MP. Thank you to all families and friends who were able to join us for their child's showcase, which helps you to see your child's progress in Physical Education and Performing Arts, in relation to other students, as well as to help you to interpret the Circus comments made in your child's report. It's very special for our students to be able to perform to an audience, other than their peers – and the presence of family members makes it even more special.

Our **School Captain team** will represent us on Wednesday of next week when the Premier of Victoria, Mr Daniel Andrews, visits Ararat to officially launch the construction of the new Bulgana wind farm. Olivia, James, Holly and Flynn will have the honour of presenting the "Welcome to Country", as part of the official ceremony. We wish them well.

As mentioned in last week's newsletter, 2016 is a year of review for our school, and we're currently in the process of gathering information as part of our self-evaluation. This process is about identifying where our school is on its improvement and development journey, considering the impact of our efforts over the past three years. It provides us with a process to collect data from a range of sources to inform our actions to improve student and professional learning, much the same as teachers use student data to identify the next steps in their learning. The reflection and self-evaluation process will help us to identify what is working well, what needs to continue, and which areas of our school's work may need to be improved or further developed. It will inform decisions relating to our new Strategic Plan, in terms of priority-setting, initiatives, strategies and actions for

improvement.

We're very keen to have input from you regarding the effectiveness of our school's programs and operations, and thank those families who have participated in our **"Community Conversations"** sessions and to our School Councillors for their facilitation of the events. Thank you, also, to families who have completed and returned to the office, the **"Community Conversations"** feedback form, included in last week's newsletter. Your input is greatly appreciated—we view it as **"explaining, not complaining"**.

There's still time for you to contribute by responding to the following simple questions by Friday of next week:

- What is our school doing well?
- What could we do better?
- What is most important to you about our school?

Please note that all families who register their feedback are eligible to win our **"Door Prize"** – a family pass to the Halls Gap Zoo.

We're very pleased to announce that our **Term 2 Sporting Schools Program** has commenced, with Mr Jamie Gatehouse conducting volleyball coaching sessions. Our Junior School students made a brilliant start to their program last Friday, developing their 'volleyballoon' skills. All classes will participate in two formal volleyball coaching sessions prior to the end of this term. Please note that our Sporting Schools Program takes place during school hours, and is funded by the Federal Government. **Mr Gatehouse** is also making the most of the opportunity to familiarize himself with our students and school routines, prior to commencing as a classroom teacher in Term 3, replacing Mrs Kelly in 5-6K.

Our Tuesday and Thursday morning **Breakfast Club** continues to be a winner with our students. Some drop in for a Milo and social chat, while others make the most of the nutritious and sustaining food on offer – porridge, baked beans, VitaBrits and fruit. 


