### Principal's Report

Dear parents and friends of Ararat Primary School 800,

Last Friday saw the arrival of our 2017 Preps for their first formal transition session — and a wonderful time was had by all. I congratulate our new students on their courage and enthusiasm, and extend sincere thanks to our current Year 4 students for their commitment and leadership as buddies.

While our 2017 Preps were settling into their new learning spaces, our Year 1 to 5 students also transitioned into their new class areas, spending the afternoon engaged in a wide range of numeracy and 'getting-know-you' activities. Please note that 2017 class groupings are not set at the moment. Our Friday afternoon whole-school transition events allow us to see different mixes of children – keeping in mind that we're striving to achieve the 'best fit' for everyone. Our transition program will continue this and next Friday afternoons, culminating in the state-wide transition day on December 6<sup>th</sup>. The final session will include an information session for the parents of our new Preps, so please set aside the morning to join us from 9:45am in the Learning Centre.

Ararat Primary School is very proud of the quality programs that we put in place to cater for the needs and interests of our students. On an annual basis, School Council prepares a budget to provide resources for educational programs, administration, facilities development and maintenance. Our income is funded from two sources:

- Department of Education and Training (DET) Student Resource Package (SRP) to pay for school administration, utilities and services, staff salaries, urgent works, maintenance, cleaning and general school operations
- Payments and contributions provided by our parent community, which are essential components of funding.

We are conscious that the current economic climate is creating financial challenges for families, so we are pleased to inform you that our fees for 2017 will not increase. The payments proposed are the minimum amount considered essential to enable School Council to continue providing the high quality standards that we have come to expect at Ararat Primary School.

As mentioned in previous newsletters, parents will be responsible for covering the full cost of essential materials, swimming programs, uniforms and camps and excursions in 2017, but eligible families will again be able to access the government's Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund. To do so, you need to hold a

current Health Care Card.

Following is a break-down of our start-up fees for 2017, so that you're able to begin budgeting. If you have any questions regarding arrangements, please feel free to contact me.

#### **ESSENTIAL MATERIALS**

'Essential Materials' are those used in the course of instruction in curriculum programs – classrooms and specialists. These items include student stationery, text books, readers, class sets, consumable materials on-line program subscriptions, and equipment for learning and teaching.

**SWIMMING** (approximately \$70, but the final cost is yet to be confirmed)

**SPECIAL PERFORMANCES** – such as the "Loose Ends" show. **Additional School Charges**




# Specialists' Report . . .












